Program Description

As the number of grandparents stepping into primary caregiving roles continues to rise, professionals across healthcare, education, and social services must be equipped to support these unique family structures. This continuing education program explores the emotional, financial, legal, and health-related challenges faced by grandparents raising grandchildren due to parental absence or instability. Participants will learn trauma-informed, culturally responsive strategies to help kinship families navigate access to services, maintain caregiver well-being, and support healthy child development. Real-world case studies and resource navigation tools will be included to enhance practical application.



Objectives

- Describe the social, emotional, and logistical challenges commonly experienced by grandparents serving as primary caregivers.
- Identify the legal, educational, and healthcare systems that intersect with kinship care and how to support caregiver access.
- Apply trauma-informed and culturally sensitive approaches when working with multigenerational families.
- Utilize community-based resources and referral networks to support grandparents and children in kinship care.
